Commences Friday at 7pm, concluding on Sunday at 4pm.

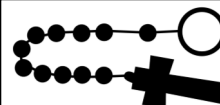

Extract from Apostolic Letter for Year of St Joseph:

Joseph - A Father in the Shadows

In his relationship to Jesus, Joseph was the earthly shadow of the heavenly Father: he watched over him and protected him, never leaving him to go his own way. Fathers are not born, but made. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person. Being a father entails introducing children to life and reality. Not holding them back, being overprotective or possessive, but rather making them capable of deciding for themselves. Joseph never made himself the centre of things. He did not think of himself, but focused instead on the lives of Mary and Jesus.
